Bill Summary

The bill eliminates the power of the governor to suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of firearms during a state of disaster emergency.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-704, **amend**
3 (7) (h) as follows:

4 **24-33.5-704. The governor and disaster emergencies - expert**
5 **emergency epidemic response committee - creation.** (7) In addition to
6 any other powers conferred upon the governor by law, the governor may:

7 (h) Suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of
8 alcoholic beverages, ~~firearms~~, explosives, or combustibles;

9 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
10 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
11 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
12 10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a
13 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
14 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
15 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
16 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
17 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
18 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
