1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION directing the Legislative Research Commission
2	to study gun violence in the Commonwealth.
3	WHEREAS, gun violence is an epidemic plaguing every state in the country; and
4	WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States passed the Bipartisan Safer
5	Communities Act in 2022 in an effort to reduce gun crime; and
6	WHEREAS, both Democrats and Republicans, including Senate Minority Leader
7	Mitch McConnell, supported the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, demonstrating that
8	gun violence prevention is an area where legislators can reach a bipartisan consensus; and
9	WHEREAS, Kentucky has one of the nation's highest rates of gun violence; and
10	WHEREAS, the rate of gun deaths in Kentucky has increased 38 percent from 2013
11	to 2022, with an average of 826 Kentuckians dying from gun violence every year; and
12	WHEREAS, the General Assembly recognizes that gun violence is a serious
13	problem in Kentucky, as evidenced by the passage of House Bill 5 and Senate Bill 20
14	during the 2024 Regular Session; and
15	WHEREAS, the General Assembly has a sacred obligation to ensure that citizens of
16	the Commonwealth can live peacefully and freely, which includes the freedom to live
17	without fear of gun violence; and
18	WHEREAS, the General Assembly can accomplish that goal without interfering
19	with the right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms;
20	NOW, THEREFORE,
21	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
22	Kentucky, the House of Representatives concurring therein:
23	→Section 1. The staff of the Legislative Research Commission is directed to
24	study the causes of gun violence and ways to prevent gun violence in the Commonwealth
25	of Kentucky.
26	\rightarrow Section 2. The study shall include but not be limited to an analysis of:
27	(1) Data on both fatal and nonfatal gun-related incidents in Kentucky;

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1 (2)Data on the impact of gun violence on the Medicaid budget; 2 (3) Legislative action taken by other states and the federal government regarding 3 the causes and costs of gun violence; 4 Existing laws in the Commonwealth that address the issue of gun violence and (4) 5 their effectiveness; and 6 (5) Existing resources to prevent gun violence. 7 \rightarrow Section 3. (1) Staff shall prepare a report of the completed study that shall 8 include but not be limited to a: 9 Description of the causes and contributing factors to gun violence in the (a) Commonwealth; 10 11 Detailed analysis of the data listed in Section 2 of this Resolution; (b) 12 Discussion of any data in Section 2 of this Resolution that is not available for (c) 13 analysis; and 14 (d) Discussion of any policy options to reduce the rate of gun violence. 15 (2)The report shall be submitted to the Legislative Research Commission for 16 referral to the Interim Joint Committee on Judiciary and the Interim Joint Committee on 17 Health Services no later than December 1, 2025. 18 \rightarrow Section 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the 19 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the 20 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to 21 designate a study completion date.

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
