**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**  
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An Act relative to the Civilian Marksmanship Program.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 123 of Chapter 140 of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 inserting a new paragraph:

3           "Notwithstanding any general law, special law, or regulation to the contrary, firearms  
4 furnished through the Civilian Marksmanship Program as established by the United States  
5 Congress shall be eligible for transfer by a licensee."
