1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 1462, Page 17, Section 571.031, Line 28,
2 by inserting after all of said section and line the following:
3

4 "571.101. 1. All applicants for concealed carry permits issued pursuant to subsection 7 of
5 this section must satisfy the requirements of sections 571.101 to 571.121. If the said applicant can
6 show qualification as provided by sections 571.101 to 571.121, the county or city sheriff shall issue
7 a concealed carry permit authorizing the carrying of a concealed firearm on or about the applicant's
8 person or within a vehicle. A concealed carry permit shall be valid from the date of issuance or
9 renewal until five years from the last day of the month in which the permit was issued or renewed.
10 The concealed carry permit is valid throughout this state. Although the permit is considered valid in
11 the state, a person who fails to renew his or her permit within five years from the date of issuance or
12 renewal shall not be eligible for an exception to a National Instant Criminal Background Check
13 under federal regulations currently codified under 27 CFR 478.102(d), relating to the transfer, sale,
14 or delivery of firearms from licensed dealers. A concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August
15 28, 2013, shall continue from the date of issuance or renewal until three years from the last day of
16 the month in which the endorsement was issued or renewed to authorize the carrying of a concealed
17 firearm on or about the applicant's person or within a vehicle in the same manner as a concealed
18 carry permit issued under subsection 7 of this section on or after August 28, 2013.

19 2. A concealed carry permit issued pursuant to subsection 7 of this section shall be issued by
20 the sheriff or his or her designee of the county or city in which the applicant resides, if the applicant:

21 (1) Is at least nineteen years of age, is a citizen or permanent resident of the United States
22 and either:

23 (a) Has assumed residency in this state; or

24 (b) Is a member of the Armed Forces stationed in Missouri, or the spouse of such member
25 of the military;

26 (2) Is at least nineteen years of age, or is at least eighteen years of age and a member of the
27 United States Armed Forces or honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces, and is a
28 citizen of the United States and either:

29 (a) Has assumed residency in this state;

30 (b) Is a member of the Armed Forces stationed in Missouri; or

1 (c) The spouse of such member of the military stationed in Missouri and nineteen years of
2 age;

3 (3) Has not [~~pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere or~~] been convicted of a crime
4 punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the
5 United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
6 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive
7 weapon, firearm, firearm silencer or gas gun;

8 (4) Has not been convicted of [~~pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to~~] one or
9 more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a five-year period immediately
10 preceding application for a concealed carry permit or if the applicant has not been convicted of two
11 or more misdemeanor offenses involving driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or
12 drugs or the possession or abuse of a controlled substance within a five-year period immediately
13 preceding application for a concealed carry permit;

14 (5) Is not a fugitive from justice or currently charged in an information or indictment with
15 the commission of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the
16 laws of any state of the United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws
17 of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an
18 explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

19 (6) Has not been discharged under dishonorable conditions from the United States Armed
20 Forces;

21 (7) Has not engaged in a pattern of behavior, documented in public or closed records, that
22 causes the sheriff to have a reasonable belief that the applicant presents a danger to himself or
23 others;

24 (8) Is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of application or for five years prior to
25 application, or has not been committed to a mental health facility, as defined in section 632.005, or a
26 similar institution located in another state following a hearing at which the defendant was
27 represented by counsel or a representative;

28 (9) Submits a completed application for a permit as described in subsection 3 of this section;

29 (10) Submits an affidavit attesting that the applicant complies with the concealed carry
30 safety training requirement pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 of section 571.111;

31 (11) Is not the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;

32 (12) Is not otherwise prohibited from possessing a firearm under section 571.070 or 18
33 U.S.C. Section 922(g).

34 3. The application for a concealed carry permit issued by the sheriff of the county of the
35 applicant's residence shall contain only the following information:

36 (1) The applicant's name, address, telephone number, gender, date and place of birth, and, if
37 the applicant is not a United States citizen, the applicant's country of citizenship and any alien or
38 admission number issued by the Federal Bureau of Customs and Immigration Enforcement or any
39 successor agency;

1 (2) An affirmation that the applicant has assumed residency in Missouri or is a member of
2 the Armed Forces stationed in Missouri or the spouse of such a member of the Armed Forces and is
3 a citizen or permanent resident of the United States;

4 (3) An affirmation that the applicant is at least nineteen years of age or is eighteen years of
5 age or older and a member of the United States Armed Forces or honorably discharged from the
6 United States Armed Forces;

7 (4) An affirmation that the applicant has not ~~[pled guilty to or]~~ been convicted of a crime
8 punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the
9 United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
10 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive
11 weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

12 (5) An affirmation that the applicant has not been convicted of ~~[, pled guilty to, or entered a~~
13 ~~plea of nolo contendere to]~~ one or more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a
14 five-year period immediately preceding application for a permit or if the applicant has not been
15 convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses involving driving while under the influence of
16 intoxicating liquor or drugs or the possession or abuse of a controlled substance within a five-year
17 period immediately preceding application for a permit;

18 (6) An affirmation that the applicant is not a fugitive from justice or currently charged in an
19 information or indictment with the commission of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term
20 exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the United States other than a crime classified
21 as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two
22 years or less that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer or gas gun;

23 (7) An affirmation that the applicant has not been discharged under dishonorable conditions
24 from the United States Armed Forces;

25 (8) An affirmation that the applicant is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of
26 application or for five years prior to application, or has not been committed to a mental health
27 facility, as defined in section 632.005, or a similar institution located in another state, except that a
28 person whose release or discharge from a facility in this state pursuant to chapter 632, or a similar
29 discharge from a facility in another state, occurred more than five years ago without subsequent
30 recommitment may apply;

31 (9) An affirmation that the applicant has received firearms safety training that meets the
32 standards of applicant firearms safety training defined in subsection 1 or 2 of section 571.111;

33 (10) An affirmation that the applicant, to the applicant's best knowledge and belief, is not
34 the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;

35 (11) A conspicuous warning that false statements made by the applicant will result in
36 prosecution for perjury pursuant to the laws of the state of Missouri; and

37 (12) A government-issued photo identification. This photograph shall not be included on
38 the permit and shall only be used to verify the person's identity for permit renewal, or for the
39 issuance of a new permit due to change of address, or for a lost or destroyed permit.

1 4. An application for a concealed carry permit shall be made to the sheriff of the county or
2 any city not within a county in which the applicant resides. An application shall be filed in writing,
3 signed under oath and under the penalties of perjury, and shall state whether the applicant complies
4 with each of the requirements specified in subsection 2 of this section. In addition to the completed
5 application, the applicant for a concealed carry permit must also submit the following:

6 (1) A photocopy of a firearms safety training certificate of completion or other evidence of
7 completion of a firearms safety training course that meets the standards established in subsection 1
8 or 2 of section 571.111; and

9 (2) A nonrefundable permit fee as provided by subsection 11 or 12 of this section.

10 5. (1) Before an application for a concealed carry permit is approved, the sheriff shall make
11 only such inquiries as he or she deems necessary into the accuracy of the statements made in the
12 application. The sheriff may require that the applicant display a Missouri driver's license or
13 nondriver's license or military identification and orders showing the person being stationed in
14 Missouri. In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a concealed carry permit, the applicant
15 shall be fingerprinted. No other biometric data shall be collected from the applicant. The sheriff
16 shall conduct an inquiry of the National Instant Criminal Background Check System within three
17 working days after submission of the properly completed application for a concealed carry permit.
18 If no disqualifying record is identified by these checks at the state level, the fingerprints shall be
19 forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check. Upon
20 receipt of the completed report from the National Instant Criminal Background Check System and
21 the response from the Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history record check, the
22 sheriff shall examine the results and, if no disqualifying information is identified, shall issue a
23 concealed carry permit within three working days.

24 (2) In the event the report from the National Instant Criminal Background Check System
25 and the response from the Federal Bureau of Investigation national criminal history record check
26 prescribed by subdivision (1) of this subsection are not completed within forty-five calendar days
27 and no disqualifying information concerning the applicant has otherwise come to the sheriff's
28 attention, the sheriff shall issue a provisional permit, clearly designated on the certificate as such,
29 which the applicant shall sign in the presence of the sheriff or the sheriff's designee. This permit,
30 when carried with a valid Missouri driver's or nondriver's license or a valid military identification,
31 shall permit the applicant to exercise the same rights in accordance with the same conditions as
32 pertain to a concealed carry permit issued under this section, provided that it shall not serve as an
33 alternative to an national instant criminal background check required by 18 U.S.C. Section 922(t).
34 The provisional permit shall remain valid until such time as the sheriff either issues or denies the
35 certificate of qualification under subsection 6 or 7 of this section. The sheriff shall revoke a
36 provisional permit issued under this subsection within twenty-four hours of receipt of any report that
37 identifies a disqualifying record, and shall notify the concealed carry permit system established
38 under subsection 5 of section 650.350. The revocation of a provisional permit issued under this
39 section shall be proscribed in a manner consistent to the denial and review of an application under

1 subsection 6 of this section.

2 6. The sheriff may refuse to approve an application for a concealed carry permit if he or she
3 determines that any of the requirements specified in subsection 2 of this section have not been met,
4 or if he or she has a substantial and demonstrable reason to believe that the applicant has rendered a
5 false statement regarding any of the provisions of sections 571.101 to 571.121. If the applicant is
6 found to be ineligible, the sheriff is required to deny the application, and notify the applicant in
7 writing, stating the grounds for denial and informing the applicant of the right to submit, within
8 thirty days, any additional documentation relating to the grounds of the denial. Upon receiving any
9 additional documentation, the sheriff shall reconsider his or her decision and inform the applicant
10 within thirty days of the result of the reconsideration. The applicant shall further be informed in
11 writing of the right to appeal the denial pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114.
12 After two additional reviews and denials by the sheriff, the person submitting the application shall
13 appeal the denial pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114.

14 7. If the application is approved, the sheriff shall issue a concealed carry permit to the
15 applicant within a period not to exceed three working days after his or her approval of the
16 application. The applicant shall sign the concealed carry permit in the presence of the sheriff or his
17 or her designee.

18 8. The concealed carry permit shall specify only the following information:

- 19 (1) Name, address, date of birth, gender, height, weight, color of hair, color of eyes, and
20 signature of the permit holder;
21 (2) The signature of the sheriff issuing the permit;
22 (3) The date of issuance; and
23 (4) The expiration date.

24 The permit shall be no larger than two and one-eighth inches wide by three and three-eighths inches
25 long and shall be of a uniform style prescribed by the department of public safety. The permit shall
26 also be assigned a concealed carry permit system county code and shall be stored in sequential
27 number.

28 9. (1) The sheriff shall keep a record of all applications for a concealed carry permit or a
29 provisional permit and his or her action thereon. Any record of an application that is incomplete or
30 denied for any reason shall be kept for a period not to exceed one year. Any record of an application
31 that was approved shall be kept for a period of one year after the expiration and nonrenewal of the
32 permit.

33 (2) The sheriff shall report the issuance of a concealed carry permit or provisional permit to
34 the concealed carry permit system. All information on any such permit that is protected information
35 on any driver's or nondriver's license shall have the same personal protection for purposes of
36 sections 571.101 to 571.121. An applicant's status as a holder of a concealed carry permit,
37 provisional permit, or a concealed carry endorsement issued prior to August 28, 2013, shall not be
38 public information and shall be considered personal protected information. Information retained in

1 the concealed carry permit system under this subsection shall not be distributed to any federal, state,
2 or private entities and shall only be made available for a single entry query of an individual in the
3 event the individual is a subject of interest in an active criminal investigation or is arrested for a
4 crime. A sheriff may access the concealed carry permit system for administrative purposes to issue
5 a permit, verify the accuracy of permit holder information, change the name or address of a permit
6 holder, suspend or revoke a permit, cancel an expired permit, or cancel a permit upon receipt of a
7 certified death certificate for the permit holder. Any person who violates the provisions of this
8 subdivision by disclosing protected information shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

9 10. Information regarding any holder of a concealed carry permit, or a concealed carry
10 endorsement issued prior to August 28, 2013, is a closed record. No bulk download or batch data
11 shall be distributed to any federal, state, or private entity, except to MoSMART or a designee
12 thereof. Any state agency that has retained any documents or records, including fingerprint records
13 provided by an applicant for a concealed carry endorsement prior to August 28, 2013, shall destroy
14 such documents or records, upon successful issuance of a permit.

15 11. For processing an application for a concealed carry permit pursuant to sections 571.101
16 to 571.121, the sheriff in each county shall charge a nonrefundable fee not to exceed one hundred
17 dollars which shall be paid to the treasury of the county to the credit of the sheriff's revolving fund.
18 This fee shall include the cost to reimburse the Missouri state highway patrol for the costs of
19 fingerprinting and criminal background checks. An additional fee shall be added to each credit card,
20 debit card, or other electronic transaction equal to the charge paid by the state or the applicant for
21 the use of the credit card, debit card, or other electronic payment method by the applicant.

22 12. For processing a renewal for a concealed carry permit pursuant to sections 571.101 to
23 571.121, the sheriff in each county shall charge a nonrefundable fee not to exceed fifty dollars
24 which shall be paid to the treasury of the county to the credit of the sheriff's revolving fund.

25 13. For the purposes of sections 571.101 to 571.121, the term "sheriff" shall include the
26 sheriff of any county or city not within a county or his or her designee and in counties of the first
27 classification the sheriff may designate the chief of police of any city, town, or municipality within
28 such county.

29 14. For the purposes of this chapter, "concealed carry permit" shall include any concealed
30 carry endorsement issued by the department of revenue before January 1, 2014, and any concealed
31 carry document issued by any sheriff or under the authority of any sheriff after December 31,
32 2013."; and

34 Further amend said bill, Page 22, Section 571.107, Line 167, by inserting after all of said section
35 and line the following:

37 "571.205. 1. Upon request and payment of the required fee, the sheriff shall issue a
38 concealed carry permit that is valid through the state of Missouri for the lifetime of the permit
39 holder to a Missouri resident who meets the requirements of sections 571.205 to 571.230, known as

1 a Missouri lifetime concealed carry permit. A person may also request, and the sheriff shall issue
2 upon payment of the required fee, a concealed carry permit that is valid through the state of
3 Missouri for a period of either ten years or twenty-five years from the date of issuance or renewal to
4 a Missouri resident who meets the requirements of sections 571.205 to 571.230. Such permit shall
5 be known as a Missouri extended concealed carry permit. A person issued a Missouri lifetime or
6 extended concealed carry permit shall be required to comply with the provisions of sections 571.205
7 to 571.230. If the applicant can show qualification as provided by sections 571.205 to 571.230, the
8 sheriff shall issue a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit authorizing the carrying of
9 a concealed firearm on or about the applicant's person or within a vehicle.

10 2. A Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit shall be suspended if the permit
11 holder becomes a resident of another state. The permit may be reactivated upon reestablishment of
12 Missouri residency if the applicant meets the requirements of sections 571.205 to 571.230, and upon
13 successful completion of a name-based inquiry of the National Instant Background Check System.

14 3. A Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit shall be issued by the sheriff or
15 his or her designee of the county or city in which the applicant resides, if the applicant:

16 (1) Is at least nineteen years of age, is a citizen or permanent resident of the United States
17 and has assumed residency in this state, or is at least eighteen years of age and a member of the
18 United States Armed Forces or honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces, and is a
19 citizen of the United States and has assumed residency in this state;

20 (2) Has not ~~[pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere or]~~ been convicted of a crime
21 punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the
22 United States, other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and
23 punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive
24 weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

25 (3) Has not been convicted of ~~[, pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to]~~ one or

10 standards of applicant firearms safety training defined in subsection 1 or 2 of section 571.111;

11 (10) An affirmation that the applicant, to the applicant's best knowledge and belief, is not
12 the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect;

13 (11) A conspicuous warning that false statements made by the applicant will result in
14 prosecution for perjury under the laws of the state of Missouri; and

15 (12) A government-issued photo identification. This photograph shall not be included on
16 the permit and shall only be used to verify the person's identity for the issuance of a new permit,
17 issuance of a new permit due to change of name or address, renewal of an extended permit, or for a
18 lost or destroyed permit, or reactivation under subsection 2 of this section.

19 5. An application for a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit shall be made

21 signed under oath and under the penalties of perjury, and shall state whether the applicant complies

9 alternative to a national instant criminal background check required by 18 U.S.C. Section 922(t).
10 The provisional permit shall remain valid until such time as the sheriff either issues or denies the
11 permit under subsection 7 or 8 of this section. The sheriff shall revoke a provisional permit issued
12 under this subsection within twenty-four hours of receipt of any report that identifies a disqualifying
13 record, and shall notify the concealed carry permit system established under subsection 5 of section
14 650.350. The revocation of a provisional permit issued under this section shall be prescribed in a
15 manner consistent to the denial and review of an application under subsection 7 of this section.

16 7. The sheriff may refuse to approve an application for a Missouri lifetime or extended
17 concealed carry permit if he or she determines that any of the requirements specified in subsection 3
18 of this section have not been met, or if he or she has a substantial and demonstrable reason to
19 believe that the applicant has rendered a false statement regarding any of the provisions of sections
20 571.205 to 571.230. If the applicant is found to be ineligible, the sheriff is required to deny the
21 application, and notify the applicant in writing, stating the grounds for denial and informing the
22 applicant of the right to submit, within thirty days, any additional documentation relating to the
23 grounds of the denial. Upon receiving any additional documentation, the sheriff shall reconsider his
24 or her decision and inform the applicant within thirty days of the result of the reconsideration. The
25 applicant shall further be informed in writing of the right to appeal the denial under section 571.220.
26 After two additional reviews and denials by the sheriff, the person submitting the application shall
27 appeal the denial under section 571.220.

28 8. If the application is approved, the sheriff shall issue a Missouri lifetime or extended
29 concealed carry permit to the applicant within a period not to exceed three working days after his or
30 her approval of the application. The applicant shall sign the Missouri lifetime or extended
31 concealed carry permit in the presence of the sheriff or his or her designee.

32 9. The Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit shall specify only the following
33 information:

- 34 (1) Name, address, date of birth, gender, height, weight, color of hair, color of eyes, and
35 signature of the permit holder;
- 36 (2) The signature of the sheriff issuing the permit;
- 37 (3) The date of issuance;
- 38 (4) A clear statement indicating that the permit is only valid within the state of Missouri;

39 and

1 (5) If the permit is a Missouri extended concealed carry permit, the expiration date.

2 The permit shall be no larger than two and one-eighth inches wide by three and three-eighths inches
3 long and shall be of a uniform style prescribed by the department of public safety. The permit shall
4 also be assigned a concealed carry permit system county code and shall be stored in sequential
5 number.

6 10. (1) The sheriff shall keep a record of all applications for a Missouri lifetime or extended
7 concealed carry permit or a provisional permit and his or her action thereon. Any record of an
8 application that is incomplete or denied for any reason shall be kept for a period not to exceed one
9 year.

10 (2) The sheriff shall report the issuance of a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
11 permit or provisional permit to the concealed carry permit system. All information on any such
12 permit that is protected information on any driver's or nondriver's license shall have the same
13 personal protection for purposes of sections 571.205 to 571.230. An applicant's status as a holder of
14 a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit or provisional permit shall not be public
15 information and shall be considered personal protected information. Information retained in the
16 concealed carry permit system under this subsection shall not be distributed to any federal, state, or
17 private entities and shall only be made available for a single entry query of an individual in the
18 event the individual is a subject of interest in an active criminal investigation or is arrested for a
19 crime. A sheriff may access the concealed carry permit system for administrative purposes to issue
20 a permit, verify the accuracy of permit holder information, change the name or address of a permit
21 holder, suspend or revoke a permit, cancel an expired permit, or cancel a permit upon receipt of a
22 certified death certificate for the permit holder. Any person who violates the provisions of this
23 subdivision by disclosing protected information shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

24 11. Information regarding any holder of a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry
25 permit is a closed record. No bulk download or batch data shall be distributed to any federal, state,
26 or private entity, except to MoSMART or a designee thereof.

27 12. For processing an application, the sheriff in each county shall charge a nonrefundable
28 fee not to exceed:

29 (1) Two hundred dollars for a new Missouri extended concealed carry permit that is valid
30 for ten years from the date of issuance or renewal;

31 (2) Two hundred fifty dollars for a new Missouri extended concealed carry permit that is
32 valid for twenty-five years from the date of issuance or renewal;

33 (3) Fifty dollars for a renewal of a Missouri extended concealed carry permit;

34 (4) Five hundred dollars for a Missouri lifetime concealed carry permit,

35 which shall be paid to the treasury of the county to the credit of the sheriff's revolving fund."; and
