2 Page 4, Line 48, by inserting after all of said line the following:

4 "Further amend said bill, Page 21, Section 571.070, Line 19, by inserting after all of said section and
5 line the following:

7 "575.095. 1. A person commits the offense of tampering with a judicial officer if, with the
8 purpose to harass, intimidate or influence a judicial officer in the performance of such officer's
9 official duties, such person:

10 (1) Threatens or causes harm to such judicial officer or members of such judicial officer's
11 family;

12 (2) Uses force, threats, or deception against or toward such judicial officer or members of
13 such judicial officer's family;

14 (3) Offers, conveys or agrees to convey any benefit direct or indirect upon such judicial
15 officer or such judicial officer's family;

16 (4) Engages in conduct reasonably calculated to harass or alarm such judicial officer or such
17 judicial officer's family, including stalking pursuant to section 565.225 or 565.227;

18 (5) Disseminates through any means, including by posting on the internet, the judicial
19 officer's or the judicial officer's family's personal information. For purposes of this section,
20 "personal information" includes a home address, home or mobile telephone number, personal email
21 address, Social Security number, federal tax identification number, checking or savings account
22 number, marital status, and identity of a child under eighteen years of age.

23 2. A judicial officer for purposes of this section shall be a judge or commissioner of a state
24 or federal court, arbitrator, special master, juvenile officer, deputy juvenile officer, state prosecuting
25 or circuit attorney, state assistant prosecuting or circuit attorney, juvenile court commissioner, state
26 probation or parole officer, or referee.

27 3. A judicial officer's family for purposes of this section shall be:

28 (1) Such officer's spouse; or

29 (2) Such officer or such officer's spouse's ancestor or descendant by blood or adoption; or

1 (3) Such officer's stepchild, while the marriage creating that relationship exists.

2 4. The offense of tampering with a judicial officer is a class D felony.

3 5. If a violation of this section results in death or bodily injury to a judicial officer or a
4 member of the judicial officer's family, the offense is a class B felony.

5 578.710. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

6 (1) "Elected official", any elected member of state government or any political subdivision
7 thereof;

8 (2) "Personal information", the same meaning as defined in section 407.1500.

9 2. A person commits the offense of unlawful disclosure of personally identifiable
10 information if he or she knowingly releases, publicizes, or otherwise publicly discloses the name,
11 home address, Social Security number, telephone number, or other personal information of an
12 elected official or a family member of the elected official with the purpose to harass, intimidate, or
13 cause death or bodily injury to the elected official or a family member of the elected official.

14 3. The offense of unlawful disclosure of personally identifiable information is a class A
15 misdemeanor. However, if a violation of this section is done with the purpose to influence an
16 elected official in the performance of such official's official duties, the offense is a class D felony.";
