6 An Act relating to handguns; amending 21 O.S. 2011,
7 Section 1290.26, as last amended by Section 18,
8 Chapter 15, O.S.L. 2013 (21 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section
9 1290.26), which relates to reciprocal agreement
10 authority; modifying requirements; and providing an
11 effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.26, as
14 last amended by Section 18, Chapter 15, O.S.L. 2013 (21 O.S. Supp.
15 2015, Section 1290.26), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 1290.26.

17 RECIPROCAL AGREEMENT AUTHORITY

18 The State of Oklahoma hereby recognizes any valid concealed or
19 unconcealed carry weapons permit or license issued by another state,
20 or if the state is a nonpermitting carry state, this state shall
21 reciprocate under the permitting law of that state.

22 A. Any person entering this state in possession of a firearm
23 authorized for concealed or unconcealed carry upon the authority and
24 license of another state is authorized to continue to carry a
concealed or unconcealed firearm and license in this state;

1 provided, the license from the other state remains valid. The
2 firearm must either be carried unconcealed or concealed ~~from~~
3 ~~detection and view,~~ and upon coming in contact with any peace
4 officer of this state, the person must disclose the fact that he or
5 she is in possession of a concealed or unconcealed firearm pursuant
6 to a valid concealed or unconcealed carry weapons permit or license
7 issued in another state.

8 B. Any person entering this state in possession of a firearm
9 authorized for concealed carry upon the authority of a state that is
10 a nonpermitted carry state and the person is in compliance with the
11 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, the person is authorized to carry a
12 concealed or unconcealed firearm in this state. The firearm must be
13 carried fully concealed ~~from detection and view,~~ or unconcealed and
14 upon coming in contact with any peace officer of this state, the
15 person must disclose the fact that he or she is in possession of a
16 concealed or unconcealed firearm pursuant to the nonpermitting laws
17 of the state in which he or she is a legal resident. The person
18 shall present proper identification by a valid photo ID as proof
19 that he or she is a legal resident in such a non-permitting state.
20 The Department of Public Safety shall keep a current list of non-
21 permitting states for law enforcement officers to confirm that a
22 state is nonpermitting.

23 C. Any person who is twenty-one (21) years of age or older
24 having a valid firearm license from another state may apply for a
