10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

11 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 13.1, as  
12 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 290, O.S.L. 2015 (21 O.S. Supp.  
13 2018, Section 13.1), is amended to read as follows:

14 Section 13.1. Persons convicted of:

15 1. First degree murder as defined in Section 701.7 of this  
16 title;

17 2. Second degree murder as defined by Section 701.8 of this  
18 title;

19 3. Manslaughter in the first degree as defined by Section 711  
20 of this title;

21 4. Poisoning with intent to kill as defined by Section 651 of  
22 this title;

23 5. Shooting with intent to kill, use of a vehicle to facilitate  
24 use of a firearm, crossbow or other weapon, assault, battery, or

1 assault and battery with a deadly weapon or by other means likely to  
2 produce death or great bodily harm, as provided for in Section 652  
3 of this title;

4 6. Assault with intent to kill as provided for in Section 653  
5 of this title;

6 7. Conjoint robbery as defined by Section 800 of this title;

7 8. Robbery with a dangerous weapon as defined in Section 801 of  
8 this title;

9 9. First degree robbery as defined in Section 797 of this  
10 title;

11 10. First degree rape as provided for in Section 1111, 1114 or  
12 1115 of this title;

13 11. First degree arson as defined in Section 1401 of this  
14 title;

15 12. First degree burglary as provided for in Section 1436 of  
16 this title;

17 13. Bombing as defined in Section 1767.1 of this title;

18 14. Any crime against a child provided for in Section 843.5 of  
19 this title;

20 15. Forcible sodomy as defined in Section 888 of this title;

21 16. Child pornography or aggravated child pornography as  
22 defined in Section 1021.2, 1021.3, 1024.1, 1024.2 or 1040.12a of  
23 this title;

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1 17. Child prostitution as defined in Section 1030 of this  
2 title;

3 18. Lewd molestation of a child as defined in Section 1123 of  
4 this title;

5 19. Abuse of a vulnerable adult as defined in Section 10-103 of  
6 Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes who is a resident of a nursing  
7 facility;

8 20. Aggravated trafficking as provided for in subsection C of  
9 Section 2-415 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

10 21. Aggravated assault and battery upon any person defending  
11 another person from assault and battery; ~~or~~

12 22. Human trafficking as provided for in Section 748 of this  
13 title, or

14 23. Domestic assault and battery that results in great bodily  
15 injury to the victim as provided for in Section 644 of this title,  
16 shall be required to serve not less than eighty-five percent (85%)  
17 of any sentence of imprisonment imposed by the judicial system prior  
18 to becoming eligible for consideration for parole. Persons  
19 convicted of these offenses shall not be eligible for earned credits  
20 or any other type of credits which have the effect of reducing the  
21 length of the sentence to less than eighty-five percent (85%) of the  
22 sentence imposed.

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1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 644, as  
2 amended by Section 1, Chapter 71, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2018,  
3 Section 644), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 644. A. Assault shall be punishable by imprisonment in  
5 a county jail not exceeding thirty (30) days, or by a fine of not  
6 more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by both such fine and  
7 imprisonment.

8 B. Assault and battery shall be punishable by imprisonment in a  
9 county jail not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by a fine of not more  
10 than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and  
11 imprisonment.

12 C. Any person who commits any assault and battery against a  
13 current or former spouse, a present spouse of a former spouse, a  
14 former spouse of a present spouse, parents, a foster parent, a  
15 child, a person otherwise related by blood or marriage, a person  
16 with whom the defendant is or was in a dating relationship as  
17 defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes, an  
18 individual with whom the defendant has had a child, a person who  
19 formerly lived in the same household as the defendant, or a person  
20 living in the same household as the defendant shall be guilty of  
21 domestic abuse. Upon conviction, the defendant shall be punished by  
22 imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one (1) year, or  
23 by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by  
24 both such fine and imprisonment. Upon conviction for a second or

1 subsequent offense, the person shall be punished by imprisonment in  
2 the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than four  
3 (4) years, or by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars  
4 (\$5,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. The provisions  
5 of Section 51.1 of this title shall apply to any second or  
6 subsequent offense.

7 D. 1. Any person who, with intent to do bodily harm and  
8 without justifiable or excusable cause, commits any assault,  
9 battery, or assault and battery upon a current or former spouse, a  
10 present spouse of a former spouse, a parent, a foster parent, a  
11 child, a person otherwise related by blood or marriage, a person  
12 with whom the defendant is in a dating relationship as defined by  
13 Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes, an individual  
14 with whom the defendant has a child, a person who formerly lived in  
15 the same household as the defendant, or a person living in the same  
16 household as the defendant with any sharp or dangerous weapon, upon  
17 conviction, is guilty of domestic assault or domestic assault and  
18 battery with a dangerous weapon which shall be a felony and  
19 punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of  
20 Corrections not exceeding ten (10) years, or by imprisonment in a  
21 county jail not exceeding one (1) year. The provisions of Section  
22 51.1 of this title shall apply to any second or subsequent  
23 conviction for a violation of this paragraph.

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1           2. Any person who, without such cause, shoots a current or  
2 former spouse, a present spouse of a former spouse, a parent, a  
3 foster parent, a child, a person otherwise related by blood or  
4 marriage, a person with whom the defendant is in a dating  
5 relationship as defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma  
6 Statutes, an individual with whom the defendant has a child, a  
7 person who formerly lived in the same household as the defendant, or  
8 a person living in the same household as the defendant, by means of  
9 any deadly weapon that is likely to produce death shall, upon  
10 conviction, be guilty of domestic assault and battery with a deadly  
11 weapon which shall be a felony punishable by imprisonment in the  
12 custody of the Department of Corrections not exceeding life. The  
13 provisions of Section 51.1 of this title shall apply to any second  
14 or subsequent conviction for a violation of this paragraph.

15           E. Any person convicted of domestic abuse committed against a  
16 pregnant woman with knowledge of the pregnancy shall be guilty of a  
17 misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for not  
18 more than one (1) year.

19           Any person convicted of a second or subsequent offense of  
20 domestic abuse against a pregnant woman with knowledge of the  
21 pregnancy shall be guilty of a felony, punishable by imprisonment in  
22 the custody of the Department of Corrections for not less than ten  
23 (10) years.

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1 Any person convicted of domestic abuse committed against a  
2 pregnant woman with knowledge of the pregnancy and a miscarriage  
3 occurs or injury to the unborn child occurs shall be guilty of a  
4 felony, punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department  
5 of Corrections for not less than twenty (20) years.

6 F. Any person convicted of domestic abuse as defined in  
7 subsection C of this section that results in great bodily injury to  
8 the victim shall be guilty of a felony and punished by imprisonment  
9 in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than  
10 ten (10) years, ~~or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more~~  
11 ~~than one (1) year.~~ The provisions of Section 51.1 of this title  
12 shall apply to any second or subsequent conviction of a violation of  
13 this subsection.

14 G. Any person convicted of domestic abuse as defined in  
15 subsection C of this section that was committed in the presence of a  
16 child shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not  
17 less than six (6) months nor more than one (1) year, or by a fine  
18 not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such  
19 fine and imprisonment. Any person convicted of a second or  
20 subsequent domestic abuse as defined in subsection C of this section  
21 that was committed in the presence of a child shall be punished by  
22 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not  
23 less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or by a fine  
24 not exceeding Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00), or by both such

1 fine and imprisonment. The provisions of Section 51.1 of this title  
2 shall apply to any second or subsequent offense. For every  
3 conviction of domestic abuse, domestic assault or domestic assault  
4 and battery with a dangerous weapon, or domestic assault and battery  
5 with a deadly weapon, the court shall:

6 1. Specifically order as a condition of a suspended sentence or  
7 probation that a defendant participate in counseling or undergo  
8 treatment to bring about the cessation of domestic abuse as  
9 specified in paragraph 2 of this subsection;

10 2. a. The court shall require the defendant to participate  
11 in counseling or undergo treatment for domestic abuse  
12 by an individual licensed practitioner or a domestic  
13 abuse treatment program certified by the Attorney  
14 General. If the defendant is ordered to participate  
15 in a domestic abuse counseling or treatment program,  
16 the order shall require the defendant to attend the  
17 program for a minimum of fifty-two (52) weeks,  
18 complete the program, and be evaluated before and  
19 after attendance of the program by a program counselor  
20 or a private counselor. Three unexcused absences in  
21 succession or seven unexcused absences in a period of  
22 fifty-two (52) weeks from any court-ordered domestic  
23 abuse counseling or treatment program shall be prima  
24 facie evidence of the violation of the conditions of



1           probation for the district attorney to seek  
2           acceleration or revocation of any probation entered by  
3           the court.

4           b.   A program for anger management, couples counseling, or  
5           family and marital counseling shall not solely qualify  
6           for the counseling or treatment requirement for  
7           domestic abuse pursuant to this subsection.  The  
8           counseling may be ordered in addition to counseling  
9           specifically for the treatment of domestic abuse or  
10          per evaluation as set forth below.  If, after  
11          sufficient evaluation and attendance at required  
12          counseling sessions, the domestic violence treatment  
13          program or licensed professional determines that the  
14          defendant does not evaluate as a perpetrator of  
15          domestic violence or does evaluate as a perpetrator of  
16          domestic violence and should complete other programs  
17          of treatment simultaneously or prior to domestic  
18          violence treatment, including but not limited to  
19          programs related to the mental health, apparent  
20          substance or alcohol abuse or inability or refusal to  
21          manage anger, the defendant shall be ordered to  
22          complete the counseling as per the recommendations of  
23          the domestic violence treatment program or licensed  
24          professional;

1           3.    a.    The court shall set a review hearing no more than one  
2                   hundred twenty (120) days after the defendant is  
3                   ordered to participate in a domestic abuse counseling  
4                   program or undergo treatment for domestic abuse to  
5                   assure the attendance and compliance of the defendant  
6                   with the provisions of this subsection and the  
7                   domestic abuse counseling or treatment requirements.  
8                   The court may suspend sentencing of the defendant  
9                   until the defendant has presented proof to the court  
10                  of enrollment in a program of treatment for domestic  
11                  abuse by an individual licensed practitioner or a  
12                  domestic abuse treatment program certified by the  
13                  Attorney General and attendance at weekly sessions of  
14                  such program.  Such proof shall be presented to the  
15                  court by the defendant no later than one hundred  
16                  twenty (120) days after the defendant is ordered to  
17                  such counseling or treatment.  At such time, the court  
18                  may complete sentencing, beginning the period of the  
19                  sentence from the date that proof of enrollment is  
20                  presented to the court, and schedule reviews as  
21                  required by subparagraphs a and b of this paragraph  
22                  and paragraphs 4 and 5 of this subsection.  Three  
23                  unexcused absences in succession or seven unexcused  
24                  absences in a period of fifty-two (52) weeks from any

1 court-ordered domestic abuse counseling or treatment  
2 program shall be prima facie evidence of the violation  
3 of the conditions of probation for the district  
4 attorney to seek acceleration or revocation of any  
5 probation entered by the court.

6 b. The court shall set a second review hearing after the  
7 completion of the counseling or treatment to assure  
8 the attendance and compliance of the defendant with  
9 the provisions of this subsection and the domestic  
10 abuse counseling or treatment requirements. The court  
11 shall retain continuing jurisdiction over the  
12 defendant during the course of ordered counseling  
13 through the final review hearing;

14 4. The court may set subsequent or other review hearings as the  
15 court determines necessary to assure the defendant attends and fully  
16 complies with the provisions of this subsection and the domestic  
17 abuse counseling or treatment requirements;

18 5. At any review hearing, if the defendant is not  
19 satisfactorily attending individual counseling or a domestic abuse  
20 counseling or treatment program or is not in compliance with any  
21 domestic abuse counseling or treatment requirements, the court may  
22 order the defendant to further or continue counseling, treatment, or  
23 other necessary services. The court may revoke all or any part of a  
24 suspended sentence, deferred sentence, or probation pursuant to

1 Section 991b of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes and subject the  
2 defendant to any or all remaining portions of the original sentence;

3 6. At the first review hearing, the court shall require the  
4 defendant to appear in court. Thereafter, for any subsequent review  
5 hearings, the court may accept a report on the progress of the  
6 defendant from individual counseling, domestic abuse counseling, or  
7 the treatment program. There shall be no requirement for the victim  
8 to attend review hearings; and

9 7. If funding is available, a referee may be appointed and  
10 assigned by the presiding judge of the district court to hear  
11 designated cases set for review under this subsection. Reasonable  
12 compensation for the referees shall be fixed by the presiding judge.  
13 The referee shall meet the requirements and perform all duties in  
14 the same manner and procedure as set forth in Sections 1-8-103 and  
15 2-2-702 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes pertaining to referees  
16 appointed in juvenile proceedings.

17 The defendant may be required to pay all or part of the cost of  
18 the counseling or treatment, in the discretion of the court.

19 H. As used in subsection G of this section, "in the presence of  
20 a child" means in the physical presence of a child; or having  
21 knowledge that a child is present and may see or hear an act of  
22 domestic violence. For the purposes of subsections C and G of this  
23 section, "child" may be any child whether or not related to the  
24 victim or the defendant.

1 I. For the purposes of subsections C and G of this section, any  
2 conviction for assault and battery against a current or former  
3 spouse, a present spouse of a former spouse, a former spouse of a  
4 present spouse, parents, a foster parent, a child, a person  
5 otherwise related by blood or marriage, a person with whom the  
6 defendant is or was in a dating relationship as defined by Section  
7 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes, an individual with whom  
8 the defendant has had a child, a person who formerly lived in the  
9 same household as the defendant, or any person living in the same  
10 household as the defendant, shall constitute a sufficient basis for  
11 a felony charge:

12 1. If that conviction is rendered in any state, county or  
13 parish court of record of this or any other state; or

14 2. If that conviction is rendered in any municipal court of  
15 record of this or any other state for which any jail time was  
16 served; provided, no conviction in a municipal court of record  
17 entered prior to November 1, 1997, shall constitute a prior  
18 conviction for purposes of a felony charge.

19 J. Any person who commits any assault and battery with intent  
20 to cause great bodily harm by strangulation or attempted  
21 strangulation against a current or former spouse, a present spouse  
22 of a former spouse, a former spouse of a present spouse, parents, a  
23 foster parent, a child, a person otherwise related by blood or  
24 marriage, a person with whom the defendant is or was in a dating

1 relationship as defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma  
2 Statutes, an individual with whom the defendant has had a child, a  
3 person who formerly lived in the same household as the defendant, or  
4 a person living in the same household as the defendant shall, upon  
5 conviction, be guilty of domestic abuse by strangulation and shall  
6 be punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of  
7 Corrections for a period of not less than one (1) year nor more than  
8 three (3) years, or by a fine of not more than Three Thousand  
9 Dollars (\$3,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. Upon a  
10 second or subsequent conviction for a violation of this section, the  
11 defendant shall be punished by imprisonment in the custody of the  
12 Department of Corrections for a period of not less than three (3)  
13 years nor more than ten (10) years, or by a fine of not more than  
14 Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), or by both such fine and  
15 imprisonment. The provisions of Section 51.1 of this title shall  
16 apply to any second or subsequent conviction of a violation of this  
17 subsection. As used in this subsection, "strangulation" means any  
18 form of asphyxia; including, but not limited to, asphyxia  
19 characterized by closure of the blood vessels or air passages of the  
20 neck as a result of external pressure on the neck or the closure of  
21 the nostrils or mouth as a result of external pressure on the head.

22 K. Any district court of this state and any judge thereof shall  
23 be immune from any liability or prosecution for issuing an order  
24 that requires a defendant to:

1 1. Attend a treatment program for domestic abusers certified by  
2 the Attorney General;

3 2. Attend counseling or treatment services ordered as part of  
4 any suspended or deferred sentence or probation; and

5 3. Attend, complete, and be evaluated before and after  
6 attendance by a treatment program for domestic abusers, certified by  
7 the Attorney General.

8 L. There shall be no charge of fees or costs to any victim of  
9 domestic violence, stalking, or sexual assault in connection with  
10 the prosecution of a domestic violence, stalking, or sexual assault  
11 offense in this state.

12 M. In the course of prosecuting any charge of domestic abuse,  
13 stalking, harassment, rape, or violation of a protective order, the  
14 prosecutor shall provide the court, prior to sentencing or any plea  
15 agreement, a local history and any other available history of past  
16 convictions of the defendant within the last ten (10) years relating  
17 to domestic abuse, stalking, harassment, rape, violation of a  
18 protective order, or any other violent misdemeanor or felony  
19 convictions.

20 N. Any plea of guilty or finding of guilt for a violation of  
21 subsection C, F, G, I or J of this section shall constitute a  
22 conviction of the offense for the purpose of this ~~act~~ title or any  
23 other criminal statute under which the existence of a prior  
24 conviction is relevant for a period of ten (10) years following the

1 completion of any court imposed probationary term; provided, the  
2 person has not, in the meantime, been convicted of a misdemeanor  
3 involving moral turpitude or a felony.

4 O. For purposes of subsection F of this section, "great bodily  
5 injury" means bone fracture, protracted and obvious disfigurement,  
6 protracted loss or impairment of the function of a body part, organ  
7 or mental faculty, or substantial risk of death.

8 P. Any pleas of guilty or nolo contendere or finding of guilt  
9 to a violation of any provision of this section shall constitute a  
10 conviction of the offense for the purpose of any subsection of this  
11 section under which the existence of a prior conviction is relevant  
12 for a period of ten (10) years following the completion of any  
13 sentence or court imposed probationary term.
