A BILL

To establish a Federal Advisory Council to Support Victims
of Gun Violence.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Resources for Victims
5 of Gun Violence Act of 2025”.

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

7 In this Act:

1 (1) ADVISORY COUNCIL.—The term “Advisory
2 Council” means the Advisory Council to Support
3 Victims of Gun Violence established under section 3.

4 (2) APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES.—The term
5 “appropriate committees” means the following:

6 (A) The Committee on Health, Education,
7 Labor, and Pensions of the Senate.

8 (B) The Committee on the Judiciary of the
9 Senate.

10 (C) The Committee on Education and
11 Workforce of the House of Representatives.

12 (D) The Committee on Energy and Com-
13 merce of the House of Representatives.

14 (E) The Committee on the Judiciary of the
15 House of Representatives.

16 (F) Any other relevant committee of the
17 Senate or of the House of Representatives with
18 jurisdiction over matters affecting victims of
19 gun violence.

20 (3) GUN VIOLENCE.—The term “gun violence”
21 means—

22 (A) suicide involving firearms;

23 (B) homicide involving firearms;

24 (C) domestic violence involving firearms;

25 (D) hate crimes involving firearms;

- (E) youth violence involving firearms;
- (F) mass shootings;
- (G) unintentional shootings;
- (H) non-fatal shootings; and
- (I) threats or exposure to violent acts involving firearms.

(A) a medical professional, including an emergency medical professional;

13 (B) a social worker;

14 (C) a provider of long-term services or
15 care; and

16 (D) a victim advocate.

(5) VICTIM OF GUN VIOLENCE.—The term “victim of gun violence” means—

(A) an individual who has been wounded as a result of gun violence;

(B) an individual who has been threatened
with an act of gun violence;

(C) an individual who has witnessed an act
of gun violence; and

**7 SEC. 3. ADVISORY COUNCIL TO SUPPORT VICTIMS OF GUN
8 VIOLENCE.**

9 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established an Advi-
10 sory Council to Support Victims of Gun Violence.

11 (b) MEMBERSHIP.—

12 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Advisory Council shall
13 be composed of the following members or their des-
14 ignees:

17 (B) The Attorney General.

18 (C) The Secretary of Education.

(E) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs.

(F) The Commissioner of Social Security.

23 (G) The Assistant Secretary for Mental
24 Health and Substance Use

(H) The Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

(I) The Director of the National Institutes of Health.

(J) The Administrator of the Administration for Community Living.

(K) The Director of the Office on Violence Against Women

(L) The Director of the Office for Victims of Crime

(M) The chairman of the Board of the Legal Services Corporation

(N) As appropriate, the head of any other Federal department or agency identified by the Secretary of Health and Human Services as having responsibilities, or administering programs, relating to issues affecting victims of gun violence.

(2) ADDITIONAL MEMBERS.—In addition to the members described in paragraph (1), the Advisory Council shall be composed of the following:

(A) Not fewer than 2 and not more than 5 victims of gun violence, who shall be appointed by the Secretary of Health and Human Services.

(B) Not fewer than 2 and not more than 5 victim assistance professionals, who shall be appointed by the Secretary of Health and Human Services.

8 (c) DUTIES.—

16 (B) conduct a literature review and assess
17 past or ongoing programs designed to assist vic-
18 tims of gun violence or individuals with similar
19 needs to determine—

20 (i) the effectiveness of the programs;
21 and

24 (C) assess the administration of compensa-
25 tion funds established after mass shootings to

1 determine best and promising practices to di-
2 rect victims of gun violence to sources of fund-
3 ing.

4 (2) INFORMATION.—

5 (A) IN GENERAL.—The Advisory Council
6 shall identify, promote, coordinate, and disseminate
7 to the public information, resources, and
8 best and promising practices available to help
9 victims of gun violence—

10 (i) meet their medical, financial, edu-
11 cational, workplace, housing, transpor-
12 tation, assistive technology, and accessi-
13 bility needs;

14 (ii) maintain their mental health and
15 emotional well-being;

16 (iii) seek legal redress for their inju-
17 ries and protection against any ongoing
18 threats to their safety; and

19 (iv) access government programs,
20 services, and benefits for which they may
21 be eligible or to which they may be enti-
22 tled.

23 (B) CONTACT INFORMATION.—The Advi-
24 sory Council shall include in the information
25 disseminated under subparagraph (A) the

1 websites and telephone contact information for
2 helplines of relevant Federal agencies, State
3 agencies, and nonprofit organizations.

(i) online through a public website;

(ii) by submitting a hard copy and
making available additional hard copies
to—

(I) each Member of Congress;

(III) each State agency that is responsible for administering health and human services, for dissemination to medical facilities;

19 (IV) each State agency that is re-
20 sponsible for administering education
21 programs, for dissemination to
22 schools; and

(V) the office of each State attorney general, for dissemination to local prosecutor's offices.

4 (A) prepare a report that—

(ii) identifies any gaps in items described in clause (i); and

16 (B) submit the report prepared under sub-
17 paragraph (A) to—

(i) the appropriate committees;

(ii) each State agency that is responsible for administering health and human services;

(iv) the office of each State attorney general; and

6 (4) FOLLOW-UP REPORT.—Not later than 2
7 years after the date on which the Advisory Council
8 prepares the report under paragraph (3), the Advi-
9 sory Council shall—

10 (A) submit to the entities described in sub-
11 paragraph (B) of that paragraph a follow-up re-
12 port that includes the information identified in
13 subparagraph (A) of that paragraph; and

(B) make the follow-up report described in subparagraph (A) available to the public online in an accessible format.

17 (5) PUBLIC INPUT.—

(ii) include representation from communities disproportionately affected by gun violence.

13 (ii) victims of gun violence; and

(iii) victim assistance professionals.

15 (C) NATURE OF OUTREACH.—In con-
16 ducting outreach under subparagraph (A), the
17 Advisory Council shall ask for input on—

15 (d) FEDERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE ACT.—Chapter
16 10 of title 5, United States Code, shall not apply to the
17 Advisory Council.

18 (e) FUNDING.—No additional funds are authorized to
19 be appropriated to carry out this Act.

20 (f) SUNSET.—The Advisory Council shall terminate
21 on the date that is 5 years after the date of enactment
22 of this Act.
